



**January 30, 2020**

A Kerala medical student returning from Wuhan becomes India's first confirmed COVID-19 case.

**March 25, 2020**

A nationwide lockdown leads to a migrant-labor crisis and a mass exodus from major cities.

**August 31, 2020**

India's GDP contracts by 23.9% in the second quarter of 2020.

**January 16, 2021**

India launches its vaccination program, starting with healthcare and frontline workers.

**April 9, 2021**

The second wave hits, with the highly contagious delta variant spreading far faster than previous strains.

**May 1, 2021**

Vaccinations open to all adults, but a shortage slows immunization efforts.

**March 15, 2020**

An elderly Karnataka man is the first to die of the novel coronavirus.

**June 1, 2020**

Phased reopening begins as India becomes one of the worst-hit countries.

**December 18, 2020**

India reaches 10 million COVID-19 cases, remaining No. 2 in global infection rankings.

**March 11, 2021**

Millions celebrate a Hindu festival, turning the sacred event into a super-spreader event.

**April 20, 2021**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi declares an emergency but resists another national lockdown, leaving it to state discretion. There is a deadly shortage of oxygen tanks.

**July 2021**

New infections and deaths slow, though experts question the accuracy of some figures.
