

# A CULTURE OF IMPROV



Improv is all about spontaneity, but experts say building a culture to foster improvisation requires a focused and intentional effort. For an article in the *MIT Sloan Management Review*, researchers surveying more than 850 managers came to these conclusions:

**1) ACCEPT CHANGE.** Greater levels of improvisation come from teams that have a positive and accepting attitude toward ambiguity and project changes.

**2) CREATE THE RIGHT TEAM STRUCTURE.** Project teams with greater improvisation had more frequent meetings and interactions with project leaders. The meetings occurred at least once a week and sometimes every day.

**3) HAVE THE RIGHT MANAGEMENT PRACTICES AND TOOLS.** Teams with greater improv abilities were more likely to use agile management techniques and tools.
